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PRESS RELEASE

Sindh Public Service Commission (SPSC) takes serious exception to the malicious campaign in some section of print and electronic media alleging corruption, favoritism and nepotism in Combined Competitive Examinations (CCE-2018) and other examinations conducted for the selection of various posts.

The reports are totally false, baseless and unfounded. The whole process of CCE-2018 and other examinations conducted was transparent and strictly in accordance with the laid down procedures.

The members of SPSC are appointed by the Government of Sindh on the basis of laid down criteria and observance of procedure as prescribed under the law. (SUO MOTO Case no 18/2016) in which chairman and some members had resigned, the Honorable Supreme Court of Pakistan not only validated the appointment of Mr Saindad Khan Solangi and Mr Ghulam Shabir Shaikh but ordered the Government of Sindh to retain the services of these two members as their appointments were made in conformity with the provision of law. Besides, no charge of any kind has been proved in any court of law against any member.

It is pointed out that there is no bar on the children of SPSC employees being Pakistani nationals equally, to compete with other candidates in open competition and qualify on merit.

A section of press has tried to create an incorrect impression that a section of population has been ignored and marginalized. It is stated that this is a rigorous competitive exam where any eligible candidate has a full freedom to compete and claim the post based on merit.

12 seats including 11 seats of urban quota had to be left vacant as adequate number of candidates from urban quota could not clear the written part of test / not found suitable in interview.

These posts will be carried forward to next Combined Competitive Examinations.

It's clarified that Sindh Public service commission adopts the domicile issued by District administration and presented by the candidate , if any citizen feels a wrong domicile has been obtained and used , appropriate course is to challenge it before the Home Department Government of Sindh as per rules .

The malicious media campaign is nothing but an attempt by some of the unsuccessful candidates, to tarnish the image of SPSC in the eyes of general public.

Sindh Public Service Commission (SPSC) being constitutional institution of the province reserves the right to take legal action against them and will take them to the court of law.
